

Choose one of the following options:

Create a Collage

1. Use a piece of cardstock or construction paper. You may use something larger if you desire.
2. Include 10 or more different words, phrases, pictures, or other images that represent the book. Images may be hand drawn, printed from computer, or cut out of magazines or newspapers.
3. The title of the book and name of the author should be somewhere on the poster in large enough print to let it stand out from the rest of the poster.
4. Categories to consider for your collage: Pictures of Characters, Personality/Feelings of Characters, Setting(s) in the book, Important Phrases or Words (Example: *Charlotte's Web* "Humble" and "Some Pig").

Construct a Diorama

1. Use a shoe box to construct a 3-dimensional diorama of an important scene from the book.
2. You may use paper, cardboard, clay, miniatures, foam, or any other items to create the scene.
3. Attach a piece of paper to the back of the box which includes the title and author of the book and a brief description of the scene depicted by the diorama.

Make a Scrapbook Page

1. Create a scrapbook page as if it were made by one of the characters in the book.
2. Include at least one photo (photo may be drawn by hand, printed from internet, or cut from magazine or newspaper).
3. Include at least one souvenir or memento. Draw, create, or collect a souvenir that the main character would have put in their scrapbook.
4. Page must include name of character as well as title and author of book.
5. Page needs to be creative, colorful, and neat.

Design a Jacket Cover

Create a new book jacket. Fold a piece of paper or cardstock in half. Make your book jacket colorful and neat. Include title and author, illustration, enticing synopsis. You may also add author bio and favorable reviews. Make the new book jacket original, do not simply copy the existing cover.

Draw a Map

Draw a map of where the story took place. Map should cover the entire page and include specific details and illustrations. See example below from *Winnie the Pooh*.
